

DPR Summer Camps: Reduced Rate

DPR's reduced rate pre-qualification period will begin on Tuesday, January 16, 2018.

During this period, applicants must come in-person to turn in and/or complete, a [reduced rate application](#). Applications will be accepted at the locations listed below, and ONLY during the designated days and times for each location:

- DPR Summer Camps Office
Columbia Heights Community Center
1480 Girard Street NW - 4th Floor (Ward 1)
Mondays: 9:30 am - 7 pm, Tuesday– Friday: 9:30 am - 5 pm
- Barry Farm Recreation Center
1230 Sumner Road SE (Ward 8)
Monday – Friday: 10 am - 2 pm
Applicants may come apply after 5pm **by appointment only**. Please call 202-442-5513 to schedule an evening appointment.
- Deanwood Recreation Center
1350 49th Street NE (Ward 7)
Monday, Wednesday, Friday: 10 am - 2 pm; Tuesday and Thursday: 5 pm – 8 pm

Please note: The Deanwood and Barry Farm locations will accept reduced rate applications only until **Friday, May 4, 2018**. If applying after Friday, May 4, 2018, all applicants must come to the DPR Summer Camp Office located at 1480 Girard St. NW

The goal of the pre-qualification period is to assist DC residents with completing their reduced rate applications so that they can easily register for summer camp when registration opens on Monday, February 5, 2018.

Families wanting to apply for a reduced rate must apply **PRIOR** to registering for camp. Reduced rate refunds will **NOT** be issued once a registration has been completed. Also, please note that a reduced rate does **NOT** apply to before and after care fees, and does not apply to REC Camps.

DPR will begin accepting [reduced rate applications](#) on Tuesday, January 16, 2018; however, applications will be accepted throughout the entire Summer 2018 season. Please note, however, that the Deanwood and Barry Farm locations will accept reduced rate applications only until Friday, May 4, 2018. If applying after Friday, May 4, 2018, all applicants must come to the DPR Summer Camp Office located at 1480 Girard St. NW

In order to qualify for a reduced rate for DPR Summer Camps, applicants must be a DC resident and must provide proof of residency and proof of income below the poverty level, according to Federal guidelines. Below are the required materials and current household income levels as established by the U.S. Federal Government (as of 2017-2018) that must be met in order to qualify:

Applicants for a reduced rate are **REQUIRED** to provide the following:

- A completed [reduced rate application](#) (please click the link to download the form, complete it and turn it in to one of the designated locations. Blank forms will also be available at all three locations.)
- A copy of your 2016 or 2017 tax return
- At least ONE document to prove DC residency (choose one of the following documents):
 - Valid DC-government issued photo ID
 - Pay stub (issued within the last 45 days)
 - Utility bill (gas, electric, or water within the past 2 months)
 - Valid DC motor vehicle registration
 - Valid lease or rental agreement
 - A notarized letter signed by the person(s) with whom you reside. The letter must include your name, your child(ren), and address. Also, two pieces of mail with your current name, address, and date, must accompany the notarized letter.

DPR Summer Camp office may request additional documents including but not limited to birth certificates and/or other income sources such as TANF, unemployment benefits, child support payments or SSI.

Applicants should keep in mind that applications can only be considered if accompanied by ALL of the required documentation.

Applications must be submitted in-person at one of the designated locations listed above. Applications sent via email or fax will not be considered nor accepted.
